Pope Francis's @Pontifex Twitter accounts reached more than 40 million, in nine different languages, has grown by over 9 million followers in the past 12 months. This is a way for Francis to personally connect with people around the world.

"Every day, through his tweets, Pope Francis makes himself available to men and women through social media, at times offering a spiritual thought, other times sharing with his followers a reflection on events of great significance for the international community.

It shows the pope's concern and "care for relationships" even over the internet, even though the pope has admitted he is not savvy with new technologies. The pope knows that the web is "a network not of wires but of people.

The pope also communicates digitally via Instagram, the social image channel. His account, @Franciscus, was approaching 5 million followers since its creation March 19, 2015. The majority of Instagram followers are from the ages of 25-34, with the United States and Brazil being the countries where it has most followers. "With a pope who is so naturally communicative, a key pastoral concern is to keep open all the channels that allow Pope Francis to speak to the world.

The faith content of what the Vatican communicates is important. The church has never had a problem with its content; the challenge is how to communicate the content in the best way for it to be heard and welcomed. The art of communicating today lies precisely in rediscovering the essence of who we are and what we have to communicate to the world and, then, how to do it.

Creativity is always part of the process. You can never just cut and paste from the past and, even less, from the world. "It tells us if there is someone out there listening or reading. It would be wrong if we didn't ask ourselves why so few people read a certain article or were interested in a particular subject."

Many who contact the Pope, say something like, 'I have done so many bad things in my life that I know I am not worthy to pray, so I beg you to pray for me.' People turn to the pope in a personal way and find in him a reference point and a welcome even though they have never met him. People also say, 'I don't go to church, but I love this pope'.

He is able to reach people, even those far from the church, because he is simply transparent. "It seems his heart is readable on his face.

The whole world is able to see his spiritual life from his expression.

Every little thing - his gestures, his smile - speaks.

"For me, this is a great lesson on where we should focus our work: on the heart, on the profundity of Christian spirituality and the spiritual lives of Christians, so that it is revealed in everything we do".

## Response from the participants

At the beginning of the day, the participants were asked to write out a simple statement of what they hoped to get out of the day.

At the end of the day, everyone split into groups to reflect more deeply one of the 10 images of Christ and its possible impact on how we Evangelise and reach out to others.

A plenary session brought all comments together and an invitation to anyone who would like to work with the Parish Good News Group to further the aims set out by the Bishops to become a Missionary Parish.

### The 10 images of Christ

- 1) Christ, the one who brings fire to the earth
- 2) Christ, the gentle one
- 3) Christ, the poor one: Speaks through the disempowered
- 4) Christ, the One who goes after the one
- 5) Christ, the imaginative one with creative love
- 6) Christ, the One conscious of the group
- 7) Christ, the liberating One
- 8) Christ, the One who prays among us
- 9) Christ, the One who depends on weak human nature
- 10) Christ, the Servant figure

### What did we hope to get out of the?

Below is a summary of some of the responses:

- To experience the hand of God on us as individuals and as a parish
- How to evangelise through my parish group
- Let our parish continue to be outward looking
- A determination to participate in at least one other activity in the parish
- Renewal more energy and enthusiasm

- I would like to start becoming a Disciple of Jesus
- That we shall experience Jesus praying among us
- To understand the evangelistic mission of the Church
- Meeting others from our Church
- More Gospel Prayer Groups
- Renewed strength in my faith

# Some thoughts and suggestions from the discussion groups and Good News Group follow up meeting

- There is so much to absorb and reflect in Fr. Michael's presentation and discussion booklet on the 10 images of Christ we need a week to absorb it all!
- We should have some follow up discussion groups (maybe in place of the Thursday evening DVD meetings) on the 10 images of Christ.
- Should we have a framed picture of the 10 images of Christ permanently displayed in the Narthex?
- "This Open Day brought me closer to my Faith"!
- Suggestions to reach out more to those who have lost touch with the church, or those with little awareness of God in their lives when they come together for Births, Marriages and Deaths.
- Suggestions to reach out to young people with Parish centred opportunities for sport, music and dance, socialising, entertainment and learning.
- Suggestions to reach out to the homeless and marginalised by inviting them in for coffee in the Bethany Room
  - Suggestions to reach out to the disempowered within the Church eg:
    - \* Divorced and re-Married
    - \* Single people
    - \* Those whose personal circumstances prevent them from receiving Holy Communion
    - \* LBGT community.
- Suggestions for ways of getting to know members of the Parish better and building community
  - \* Invite / Mobilise people using information from the Parish register. Send occasional email greetings
  - \* Organise International / Cultural nights
  - \* Say "Hello" to one person you don't know each time you go to Mass.
- Prayer is itself a form of action. Pray as if every thing depends on God. Work as if every thing depends on us.
- We need more opportunities to develop religious knowledge and study the scriptures to help us become disciples of Jesus rather than his customers.

### Summary of our strategic aims to become a Missionary Parish


Through the Proclaim15 initiative, the Bishops of England and Wales all Parishes were asked to set themselves the following targets:
